Cyfanfyd has recently launched a project targeting the BME and Faith sector in Wales.

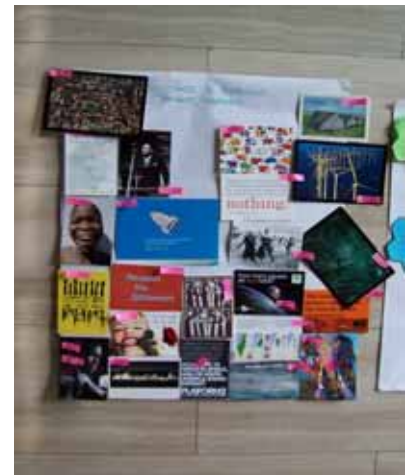
With this project, we aim to raise the capacity of BME and faith sector to deliver ESDGC 'Education for Sustainable Development and Global Citizenship' in their local communities.

Furthermore, we intend to work in partnership, build links and enrich existing delivery by incorporating black, southern and faith perspectives into 'mainstream' ESDGC work.
